KEY TO COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Beginner. These courses are open to all students, but are designed specifically for new writers.

Intermediate. These courses are for stulNT dents with writing experience and some familiarity with workshops.

ALL All. These courses are for writers of all experience levels—including beginners!

PRO/Advanced. Space may be limited in these courses for students not enrolled in PRO. A manuscript review may also be required for new students.

Generative. These courses focus on creating new work through exercises and prompts.

Seminar. These courses examine literary schools, craft, and/or writing theory in practice; reading is often required.

WRK Workshop. These courses focus on peer critique and/or revision strategies.

MS Multiple Styles. Classes will incorporate multiple instruction styles.

DWC Course will take place in-person at the Downtown Writers Center

ONLINE Course will take place online (e.g. Zoom)

HYBRID Students can join either in-person at the Downtown Writers Center or online.

ASYNCH Students write and share work without a weekly scheduled class.

FALL 2024 CREATIVE WRITING COURSES

POETRY COURSES

READING POEMS, TALKING POETRY

(BEG - MS - ONLINE) with Derek Pollard. Mondays, 6 to 8 PM. 8 weeks, starting October 14. Ever read a poem so good you wanted to share it with everyone? That's what this workshop is all about! We'll share the poems we love so we can apply the lessons they teach us in our own writing.

PRO POETRY WORKSHOP

(PRO - WRK - ONLINE) with Suzanne Frischkorn. Tuesdays, 5 to 7:30 PM. 8 weeks, starting October 15. Elevate your poems in this collaborative poetry workshop that investigates how great poems work. WRITING FORM POEMS

(INT - SEM - HYBRID) with Gemma Cooper-Novack. Wednesdays, 6 to 8 PM. 8 weeks, starting October 16. Stymied by sestinas? Vexed by villanelles? In this class, we'll tackle various poetic forms, explore their histories, read and discuss contemporary examples, and most importantly, write and share our own poems!

OVERCOMING WRITERS BLOCK

(ALL - GEN - ONLINE) with Gloria Heffernan. Wednesdays, 10 AM to 12 PM. 8 weeks, starting October 16. We all face it at some point. The blank page that leaves us uninspired or incapable of writing a single word. In this supportive and generative workshop, we'll explore ways to overcome those dry spells and, yes, we'll write poems!

POETIC LINESCAPES

(INT - GEN - DWC) with Sara Parrott. Thursdays, 6 to 8 PM. 8 weeks, starting October 17. This workshop explores how poets use language to "paint" captivating portraits, landscapes, and still lifes. We will read Diane Seuss, Tarfia Faizullah, Antonio Machado, and others to spur our ideas and develop them into drafts for critique. This class meets in person at the DWC.

FICTION COURSES

THE WRITER'S LIFE, PART ONE

(INT - WRK - ONLINE) with Chris DelGuercio. Tuesdays, 6 to 8 PM. 8 weeks, starting October 15. What makes a successful writer? This class helps beginners discover how to maintain a productive writing mindset, find a process that works for them, and overcome obstacles so they can reach their full literary potential!

OPEN FICTION WORKSHOP

(ALL - WRK - DWC) with Virgie Townsend. Thursdays, 5 to 7 PM. 8 weeks, starting October 17. Writers will draft, read, and workshop fiction in a supportive community focused on celebrating creativity and care. This class will be in person at the Downtown Writers Center.

NONFICTION COURSES

INTRODUCTION TO MEMOIR

(BEG - MS - ONLINE) with Susan Keeter. Mondays, 6 to 8 PM. 6 weeks, starting October 21. Do you want to write a memoir or help a loved one write theirs? We'll use prompts based on StoryCorps questions and Modern Love's "36 Questions that Lead to Love," to help you write a manuscript that is soul-searching, intimate and satisfying.

THE FALL FLOW: NONFICTION WORKSHOP

(ALL - WRK - ONLINE) with Georgia Popoff. Wednesdays, 6 to 8 PM, starting October 16, and Thursdays, 1 to 3 PM, starting October 17. 8 weeks. Our popular nonfiction critique workshop continues with weekly comments and detailed critique. We welcome new members, so if you are working on a nonfiction project or need encouragement to resume your writing practice, join us!

FLASH NONFICTION

(ALL - MS - ONLINE) with Dan Simpson and Ona Gritz. Thursdays, 5 to 7 PM, starting October 17. 8 weeks. FINDING YOUR SPACE AS AN LGBTQ+ WRITER

How can LGBTQ+ writers find space for our work and identify the literary traditions and present moments to which we may belong? We'll read fiction, poetry, and scripts by LGBTQ+ writers, and use these works to develop your own understanding, voice, and skills as a queer writer.

PRO PROSE WORKSHOP

(PRO - WRK - ONLINE) with Kayla Blatchley. Thursdays, 6 to 8:30 PM. 8 weeks, starting October 17. Through sharing and critiquing each other's work, this class explores how fiction and non-fiction writers craft personal stories that relate to the larger social, cultural, and historical concerns of our time. DRAMATIC WRITING

WRITE A PLAY WITH A SNAP, CRACKLE, AND POP!

(ALL - MS - ONLINE) with Len Fonte. Thursdays, 6 to 8 PM. 8 weeks, starting October 17. Conflict, diction, and disruption are the basic tools of the playwright. We'll explore them in a series of exercises and move into writing a 10-minute play or scene. Appropriate for first-timers and writers with experience.

SUSAN KEETER is an children's book illustrator and author and writes non-fiction for all ages. *Sunday's Wheels* was published in Ghana and received the CNY Book Award. Keeter has an MFA from Syracuse University.

PHIL MEMMER founded the Downtown Writers Center in 2000. His sixth book of poems, *Cairns*, was published in 2022.

SARA PARROTT is the author of *Tipping the Water Jar of Heaven*. Her poems have appeared in *Michigan Quarterly Review*, *Dappled Things*, and *Light on the Walls of Life*.

DEREK POLLARD currently serves as the Poets on Poetry Series Editor at the University of Michigan Press. He's a widely published poet and critic, as well as a longtime educator and workshop leader.

GEORGIA A POPOFF is the author of five books of poetry, most recently, *Living with Haints* (Tiger Bark Press 2024). She currently serves as Poet Laureate of Onondaga County.

DANIEL SIMPSON's poetry collection, *Inside the Invisible*, won the Propel Poetry Prize and was nominated for the American Academy of Poets Lenore Marshall Poetry Prize.

VIRGIE TOWNSEND is the author of the fiction chapbook *Because We Were Christian Girls*, which won the 2022 CNY Book Awards for Fiction. Her writing has been featured in The New York Times, Washington Post, and others.
